Morning session

1 The value of planning for green infrastructure and it's role in place-making – James Carpenter, Regeneration East Midlands

This session will examine, through presentation and facilitated discussion, how green infrastructure can shape communities, and how planning for green infrastructure can help meet the requirements of the Code for Sustainable Homes.

2 The economic value of green infrastructure – Will Williams, Natural England

How can a well-planned network of green infrastructure add economic value to an area? How can these added benefits be maximised? These and other questions will be answered during this workshop session.

3 Delivering green infrastructure: the developer's perspective – Ian Dudley, Lockhart Garratt

This workshop will look at the practical delivery of green infrastructure by forward-thinking developers.

Afternoon session

1 Building green roofs for energy and biodiversity – Dusty Gedge, Living Roofs

Led by leading green roofs expert Dusty Gedge, this workshop will show how green roofs can play an important role in green infrastructure - adapting cities to climate change, reducing local flash floods and bringing nature back to town.

2 Concept statements – Mick McLoughlin, Planning Co-operative

Attendees to this workshop will be led through the design of a concept statement, as an effective means of engaging with planners.

3 Biodiversity and Green Space – Helen O'Brien, Nature Conservation Officer, Leicester City Council

This workshop will identify the current and potential areas of green space within Leicester City; the habitats they contain and the main threats to their decline. Groups will discuss how these areas can be sustained, enhanced, improved, protected and marketed to promote and conserve Leicester's green spaces. The benefits to biodiversity of linking green spaces through a series of "stepping stones" or corridors and the promotion of green infrastructure through a framework of policy, legislation and government and local community involvement will be explored.
