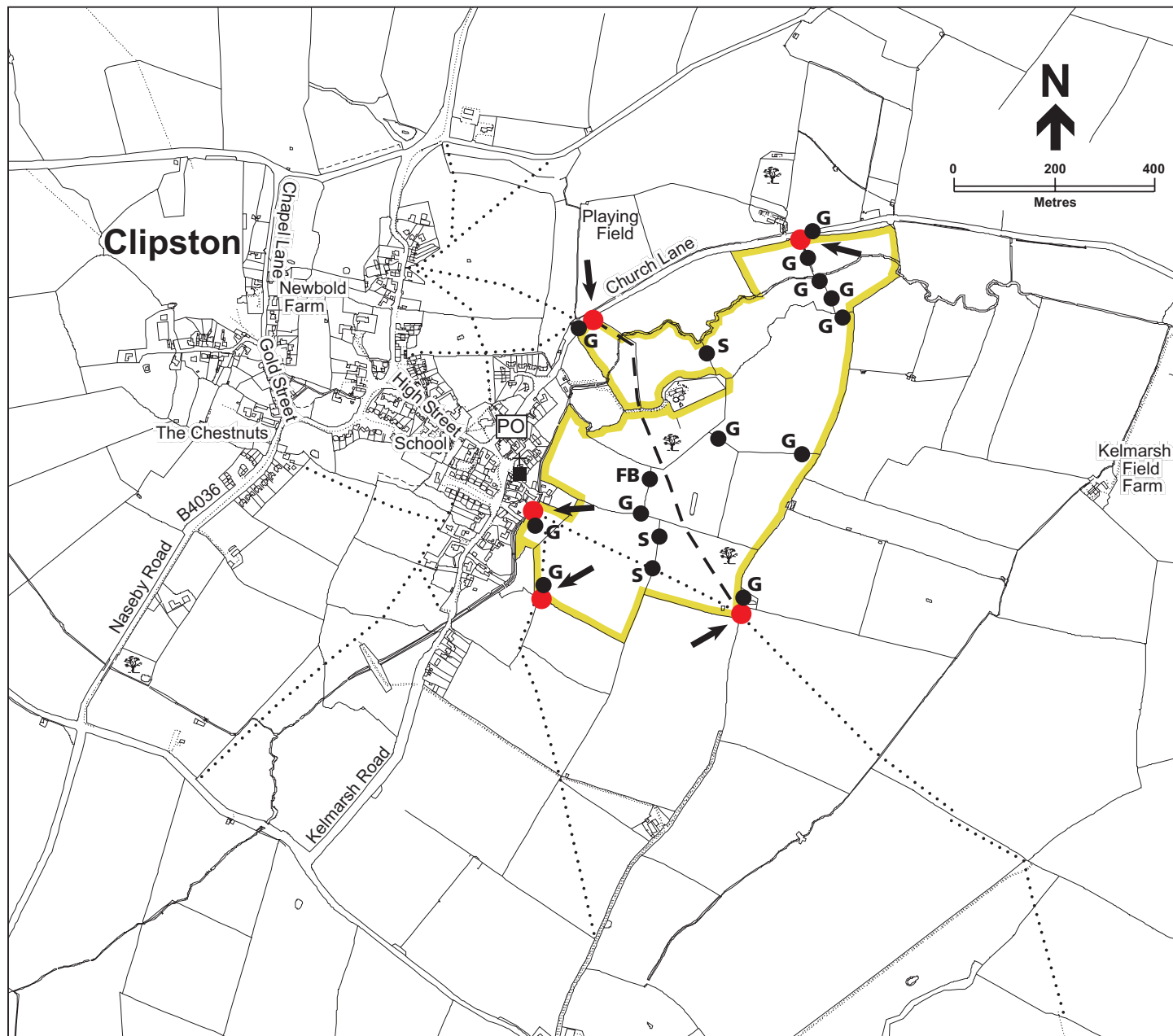


PERMISSIVE ACCESS

This area has remained largely unimproved by modern agricultural methods and is managed today as it has been for many years, as traditional cattle and sheep rearing grassland. Ridge and furrow (a relic of medieval strip farming) is evident in many of the fields. A tributary of the River Ise flows along the northern side of the site. Attractive views of the surrounding area can be seen from the higher parts of the site.
