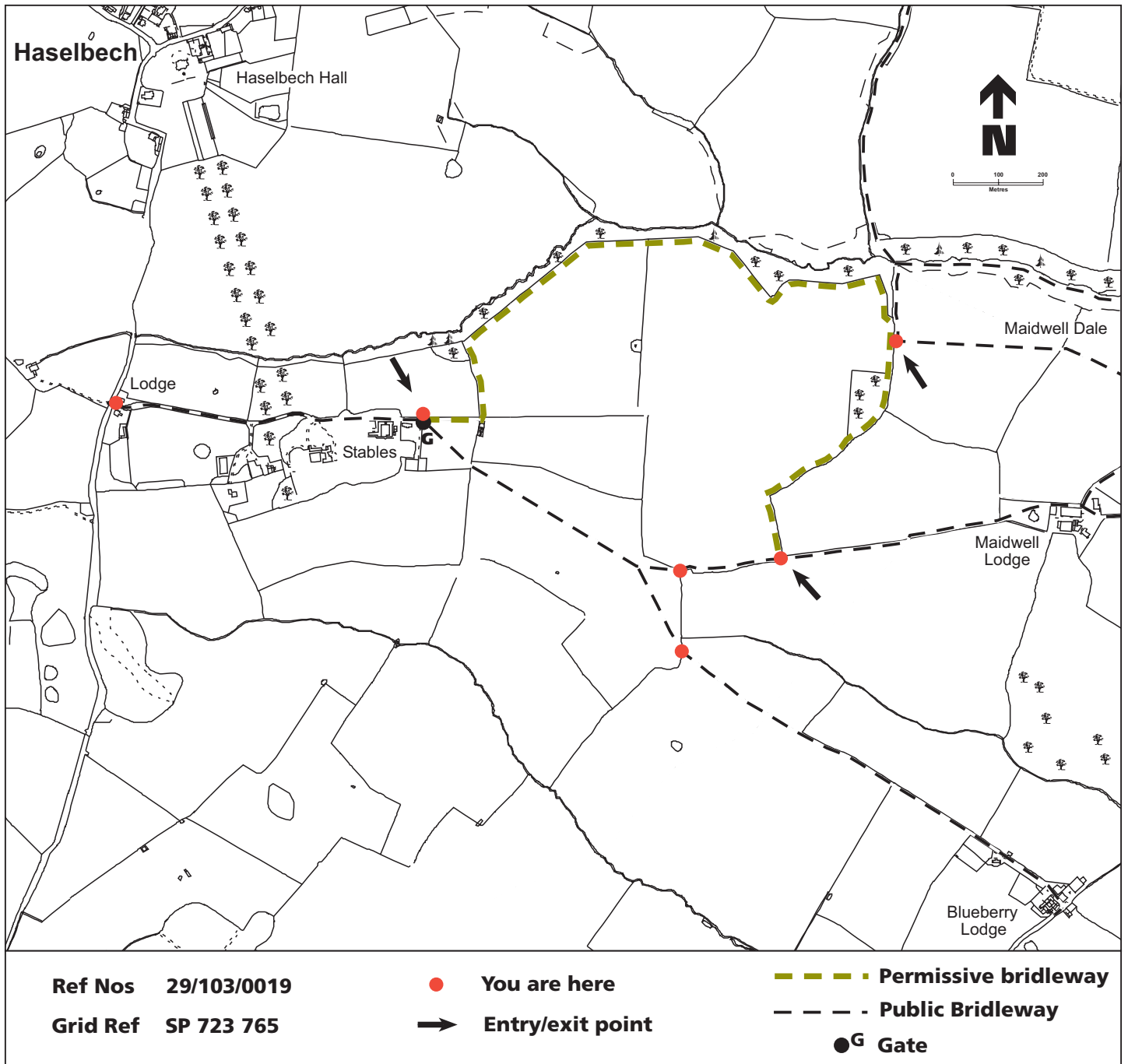


CONSERVATION WALKS

This permissive bridgeway offers a pleasant circular ride or walk around Haselbech's countryside and links up with a number of existing public rights of way including the Macmillan Way. The route runs through Haselbech Hall's historic parklands and follows the edge of Maidwell Dale Wood. At one point the permissive route passes through a small block of woodland which has been left to naturally regenerate. The hedgerow restoration work and arable margin creation will benefit the wildlife found within this area and enhance the local landscape views.



This access has been provided under the Department for Environment, Food & Rural Affairs' farm conservation schemes, which help farmers and land managers protect and improve the countryside, its wildlife and history. It is permissive access and no new rights of way are being created. Existing rights of way are not affected. Please follow the Country Code and observe any other requirements shown above. Do not disturb wildlife, livestock or other visitors and in particular keep dogs under control. This is working farmland so please take care; people using this site do so at their own risk. Access ends in September 2014.
